




Higher values of UGPA growth are associated with higher values of 1L LGPA.

The effect is comparable to final UGPA and LSAT score.

Our index accounting improves representation by about 4 percentage

IMPLICATIONS

UGPA growth **predicts** crucial early law school outcomes **similarly** to LSAT score and UGPA while introducing **fewer racial and ethnic inequities**.

Students who exhibit exemplary UGPA growth may embody growth mindset, which prior research has associated with better grades and retention, to achieve compensatory academic momentum in college (e.g., Akos et al., 2022; Burnette et al., 2022; Hu et al., 2011).

As law schools seek new means of fostering diverse learning environments post-Students for Fair Admissions v. Harvard, **UGPA growth** may prove a **viable supplement** to LSAT score and final UGPA in admissions.
